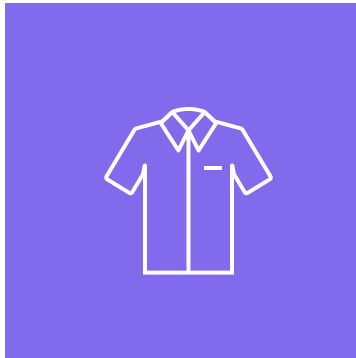

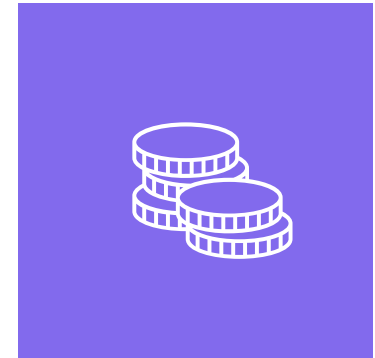

What to Bring and Prepare



Your passport, evidence of sufficient funds to support your stay in PH, hotel accommodation bookings, and return tickets.

If you have a passport issued by Australia, New Zealand, the United Kingdom, or the United States, you can enter the Philippines without a visa and stay for up to 30 days, provided:

- You are traveling to the Philippines for business or tourism.
- You have valid return or outbound tickets to your country of origin or next destination.
- Your passport is valid for at least 6 months after your planned stay in the country.

Within 72 hours before your scheduled arrival in the Philippines, please register through the eTravel portal: <https://etravel.gov.ph>.

This replaced the paper-based arrival and departure cards.



Credit card and cash. Ensure you have enough local currency (₱ - Philippine Peso) to cover your airport transfer and daily transportation from the hotel to the office and vice versa.



Prepare your itinerary ahead of time. Please communicate your plans to the Client Relationship Manager (CRM) weeks prior to your visit.



Prescriptions or over-the-counter medication, if needed.



Wall socket adapters for your gadgets as the common voltage in the Philippines is 220 volts.



Travel insurance is optional, but highly encouraged.

The Borough

A hidden culinary gem in Tarlac, this pizza parlour offers unique flavours you won't find at other pizza shops.

Must-try: Queen Elizabeth Pizza, chicken pesto pasta, BBQ bacon beef burger pizza.



Good Earth Farms and Food

A restaurant-café that serves farm-to-table dishes made from homegrown organic ingredients.

Must-try: Tanglad chicken (organically grown chicken marinated in lemongrass and organic herbs and spices), lechon belly (pork belly).

For adventurous eaters: Tofu sisig (tofu with onions seasoned with herbed vinegar), malunggay (moringa) pizza (made from hand-tossed crust topped with moringa flakes, tuna bits, and cheese), saluyot (jute leaves) pizza.



Betty's Native Cakes

Famous for its local rice cakes and other Filipino rice delicacies.

Must-try: Duman (rice cake with creamy coconut topping), capit roll (rice cake in a roll with toasted coconut milk curd), tibok-tibok (white pudding made of water buffalo's milk).



Rustica

Reminiscent of Spanish grandeur, this place caters to those who like fine dining with delicious and authentic Filipino cuisines.

Must-try: Bacon-wrapped cream dory (striped catfish), sinigang bangus belly (stewed milkfish belly in tamarind broth), crispy tadyang ng baka (crispy beef ribs), spicy prawns.

Tarlac Recreational Park

A 78-hectare property offering a variety of outdoor activities such as Dune Buggy riding, airsoft (a sport where players engage in simulated gun combat), mountain biking, camping and zipline.



Kart City Tarlac

The perfect spot for adrenaline junkies as it features a 700-metre racing kart track, European go-karts, and lapse timer system for racing activities.



Waterfalls adventure in Mayantoc

Anzap Twin Falls is the tallest waterfall in Tarlac, surrounded by abundant foliage.

Kiti-Calao Falls is named after the local Kalaw bird (Rofous Hornbill) which used to be common in the area but is now endangered. This spot can be reached by an hour's trek.

Mount Damas

One of the most picturesque hiking spots in Tarlac, measuring about 685 metres above sea level. The hike will take about 1-2 days to complete and involves trekking steep routes, rivers, rappelling down a waterfall, and crossing roped segments to the site.



Balsa River

With Class II rapids, Balsa River is the perfect destination for new kayakers.





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
